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on his face. He would pull his hand over his face, seemingly in an attempt to remove or deal with his troubling frustration about the matter. He often said it was an elongated hiddenness that reached back to the war years and the unfathomable and inexplicable death of so many. It stretched all the way to our modern times, that is our yearning for the presence of Hashem in our lives, our davening and beseeching Him to be good and kind to us, vet we often find a profound silence and a deeply mysterious concealment. Another one of his consistent messages to the shul was to "make sure that you are always needed." That way, Rav Nayman explained, you are somewhat indispensable down here on earth because others are depending on you.

In his late nineties, after all those decades of experience, having lost so much he still could not grasp what it was that Hashem was telling us by being so obscure and so still.

The rabbi davened at the front of the relatively small shul with such intensity. His presence for all those years after all that he had endured was a source of comfort, hope, and inspiration. Just being in his presence for all those years was a very special privilege.

I once saw a rather poignant billboard in Israel that read, "The Jewish future is in our past." It's a pithy little sentence but one that rings especially true at Rosh Hashanah. After all, we are indeed the sum total of our experiences. I suppose that it is that precious personal past that makes us who we are and allows us to act as a conduit to our children and grandchildren and somehow communicate to them what it was like to daven on Rosh Hashanah in the presence of greatness and all that was good with the world. At this time of year, all I have to do is close my eyes, which enables me to see it all so clearly. Kesivah v'chasimah tovah to all. �

With your help, she was able to get a wedding gown and all the necessities for her big day. Words cannot express my feelings for your generous chesed and help. May Hashem always help you continue this important work. I know the difference it made in our lives. There is no one more deserving of your chesed than my daughter, who does so much chesed of her own. She thanks you also from the bottom of her heart. I pray for a recovery so that I may one day repay you for your kindness. In the meantime, I can only thank you again from the depths of my heart for allowing my daughter to get married with dignity and a wonderful start on a new life. Thank you! Thank you! Thank you! Sincerely, Mrs. R."

"To the incredible volunteers of Avigdor's Helping Hand," writes another grateful beneficiary: "Not long ago, I received a check in the mail. This was no ordinary check. Yes, it provided me with tremendous financial assistance I very much needed; however, this check gave me so much more than that. That tiny piece of paper brought a sense of relief and lifted a huge burden off my shoulders. Making a Jewish wedding is no small feat. Baruch Hashem, I come from a very loving home, I have three younger siblings and, up until five years ago, two very loving parents. "Needless to say, that left my family emotionally, physically, and financially depleted. My father does everything he can to provide for me and my three siblings. Unfortunately, wedding expenses are just out of his capabilities. A little over a year ago, my sister, b'H, got engaged. My father really had nothing to give and so I took it upon myself to find the much-needed finances. I wanted to make sure my sister wouldn't have to stress as a kallah and that my father would not have to feel embarrassed about being able to provide financially. Baruch Hashem for your incredible organization a huge load was taken off and I was able to hand my father a sizable amount of money to be able to help out with the wedding.

"I knew at that point that, iy'H, when my time came that there would be financial help out there for me. Baruch Hashem, this past March I became engaged to an incredible guy. My chassan's family was amazing when he explained my family's financial situation to them. They themselves are not wealthy in any way,



yet they took on the financial burden upon themselves and told me not to worry about anything. As amazing as it was, it left me with a guilty feeling. It wasn't fair to leave the entire burden on them. When I received the call that Avigdor's Helping Hand would be providing me with \$5,000, I can't tell you the relief and happiness that flooded me. I was able to pay my in-laws back, even just a fraction of the money they have been spending on this wedding.

Tragically, Avigdor was just 30 years old when he passed away, on September 29, 2005, leaving his family devastated. His petirah left a terrible void in the entire community. Overwhelmed though they were with grief, Avigdor's family and friends immediately sought to create a charity that would perpetuate his precious life and be a treasured legacy for this exemplary ba'al chesed. For Frumi,

ents, wives without their beloved husbands, and husbands without their cherished wives. Even before the economic impact begins to engulf them, the magnitude of their suffering is too much to bear.

Even in cases where insurance or governmental assistance are available, it may take weeks or months for these benefits to be processed and made accessible to the family. Avigdor's Helping Hand seeks to provide immediate emergency short-term financial relief to the families in our community who have suffered the recent loss of their primary breadwinner.

"Everything is done according to da'as Torah," Eli Glaser, Avigdor's father, told the 5TJT. "Among the esteemed rabbanim who are our rabbinical advisors are Rabbi Noach Isaac Oelbaum, who is our posek, Rabbi Dovid Weinberger, Rabbi Peretz Steinberg, Rabbi Yisroel Reisman, Rabbi Henach Savitsky, and Rabbi Yakov Friedman. We consult with them whenever a she'ellah arises."

Since its inception, Avigdor's Helping Hand has dispensed \$3.2 million, made approximately 485 weddings for orphans, and helped 125 qualified families who have suffered the tragic loss of a spouse. In the wake of Hurricane Sandy, AHH dispensed \$20,000 to families who had been devastated by the storm in the affected communities of the Five Towns, Bayswater, Belle Harbor, and Sea Gate. Each applicant is required to submit two letters

Avigdor Glaser, $z^{7}\bar{l}$, was the very essence of a ben Torah. Adored by his wife Frumi and their three children and beloved by his parents and siblings, he touched the hearts of all who knew him. He was blessed with the ability to succeed in all of his endeavors; to know Avigdor was to love him.

After studying in Merkaz HaTorah in Eretz Yisrael, he pursued his undergraduate studies at Queens College, and then went on to Fordham Law School, where he graduated at the top of his class. Brilliant and gifted, yet unassuming and personable, this
